Environment Description: There is a risk of injury to a participant due to the Environment	Causes: Student becomes lost Consequences	 The boundaries are clearly defined at the beginning of the activity Appropriate staff supervision is implemented. Environment Description: There is a risk of injury to a participant due to weather event/conditio ns	Causes: Exposure to cold and wet conditions Exposure to hot and windy conditions Hit by lightening Bushfire	 Monitor weather and warnings prior to and during activity Staff trained and aware of Emergency Response Plan in the event of a bushfire and/or severe weather event Staff to ensure participants are dressed appropriately for hot/cold weather conditions Staff will encourage students to wear sunscreen and hat during high UV periods Weather protocols are followed Apply 30/30/30 Rule 	Effective	Severe	Rare	Medium
