*Please note that sessions in white are all students working together, however the three sessions on Tuesday evening are 25-minute rotations in the established student groups.

What students should expect in each of the sessions

Communal Art Piece	After the welcome ceremony, students will each create an art piece using symbols from their handbooks, these pieces will be retained at Blackwood to form a Warin-bik 2026 mural
Traditional Stories with Ron Murray	Students will sit together and listen to a range of dreamtime stories, being engaged and entertained by the talented Uncle Ron
Wild Action Native Animals	Students will get up close with a range of native Australian animals and learn about their habitats, food sources and unique attributes.
Native Plants and their uses	Students will explore native flora and fauna, learning about plant habitats and the traditional uses of native plant foods.
Bush Toys	Students will learn about the significance of bush toys and have the opportunity to create their own.
Indigenous Constellations	Students will have the opportunity to learn about and explore Indigenous star constellations and hear stories about them
Indigenous Seasons	Students will learn about the Warin seasons calendar, and what animals and plants are present at different times of the year
Australian Megafauna	Students will become palaeologists and unearth one of Australia's megafauna, using footprints to identify which one they have unearthed.
Traditional Games	Students will enjoy participating in a variety of games created by Aboriginal people, having fun and working in teams.
Traditional Dance	Students will discover the meaning and purpose behind Aboriginal dances, Learning the movements, rhythms and stories passed through generations

Traditional Tools	Students will explore traditional tools and their uses. Learning how these items connect to culture and country
Dillybags and Bush Medicines	Learn the cultural significance of woven bags and students will have the opportunity to create their own. Each piece holds strength and connection to country.
Jewellery making	During our final session students will have the opportunity to create their own beaded bracelet or necklace to take home with them.
Student handbooks	Each student will be provided with their own student handbook, these are to be worked through during the free time, and non session times. They will be used during the communal art piece
